

Water Use Licence Application for the Kingsburgh eThekweni Waste Water Treatment Works Background Information Document

Purpose of the Document

This Background Information Document (BID) provides Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) with information on the Water Use Licence Application (WULA) being done by Phelamanga for Kingsburgh Waste Water Treatment Works in the vicinity of Kingsburgh.

This BID provides I&APs with the opportunity to register as stakeholders in this process; and comment on the Water Use Licence Application. The purpose is to identify and evaluate potential impacts, to recommend measures to avoid or reduce negative impacts and to enhance positive impacts. The decision-making authority for the WULA is the Department of Water and Sanitation.

You will be included in the stakeholder database and receive further documents for review and comment/s. Your comments will ensure that all issues of concern are incorporated. 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Background

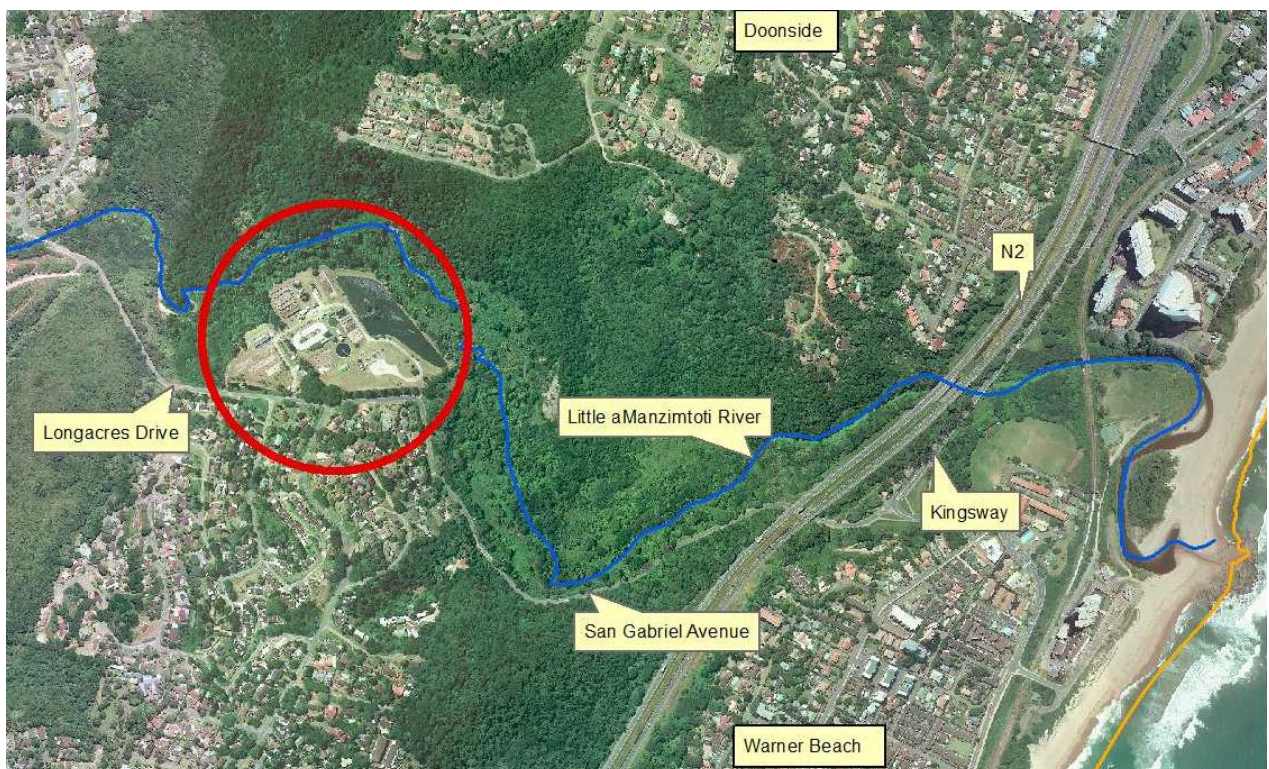


Figure 1 Kingsburgh Waste Water Treatment Works

Kingsburgh Waste Water Treatment Works is situated along the South bank of Little aManzimtoti River, about 1km inland of N2. The area is mainly residential and natural vegetation – Figure 1.

Kingsburgh Waste Water Treatment Works provides waste water treatment for effluent from the Kingsburgh, Warner Beach, parts of Illovo and inland area. The Waste Water Treatment Works has to date been operating at an output of 5 000m³ / day with a maximum capacity of 7 800m³.

Proposed Project

eThekweni has identified that the Kingsburgh Waste Water Treatment Works requires a Water Use Licence to ensure compliance with the relevant legislation. eThekweni has recognised a need to expand the capacity of the treatment works to meet the growing demands of the area and the development and growth anticipated. The City also needs to plan for long term future development in the catchment.

Water Use Licence Application

In order for eThekweni to lawfully continue with the proposed Water Use, the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) requires a Water Use Licence Application (WULA) to be submitted. In terms of the National Water Act (NWA) (Act 36 of 1998), the National Government, acting through the Minister of Water and Sanitation, is the public trustee of South Africa's water resources, and must ensure that water is protected, used, development, conserved, managed and controlled in a sustainable and equitable manner for the benefit of all persons.

The Minister is responsible to ensure that water is allocated equitably and used beneficially in the public interest, while promoting environmental values. Government, acting through the Minister, has the power to regulate the use, flow and control of all water in South Africa.

Water Use Licence Application Process

- Uses to be Licensed

In terms of the National Water Act the following water uses pertaining to this application require licensing under the following sections of the Act:

Section 21 (c): Impeding or Diverting the Flow of Water in a Watercourse; (this relates to any construction near to a

wetland or a 100 year floodline)

Section 21 (f) discharging waste or water containing waste into a water resource through a pipe, canal, sewer, sea outfall or other conduit; (this relates to the discharge of treated effluent into the river)

Section 21 (g) disposing of waste in a manner which may detrimentally impact on a water resource; (this relates to the operation of a treatment works which has the potential to impact surface and underground water) and

Section 21 (i): Altering the Bed, Banks, Course or Characteristics of a Watercourse.(this relates to any construction near to a wetland or a 100 year floodline)

- Public Participation

The public participation process is designed to elicit a joint effort by stakeholders to produce better decisions than if they had acted independently. The primary aim of such a process is to facilitate better decision-making.

The following activities will be utilised in the public participation process towards the application of the WULA:

- Advertising: Public notice in local newspapers;
- Contacting stakeholders, notifying them of the process;
- Documenting all correspondence within the Draft Technical Report; and
- Notifying stakeholders when the Water Use License is issued.

- Draft Technical Report

The Draft Technical Report includes, amongst others, the following:

- Project Description;
- Environmental Status Quo;
- Quantitative Risk Assessment;
- Integrated Environmental Management;
- Monitoring systems;
- Operational Management; and
- References and Specialist studies
